**BACKGROUND**

The Wildland Vegetation Program is tasked to collaboratively manage vegetation across the over 126,000 acres of Park District lands. Our program provides technical assistance and leadership on projects focused on inventory, monitoring and restoration and enhancement of vegetation communities in the parks. For this presentation, staff will present to the Board Committee some of the unique botanical (plant) treasures in grasslands that include rare and unusual plants and uncommon vegetation communities that occur in the Park District. Staff will highlight the current efforts underway for inventorying and monitoring unique botanical resources in grasslands, as well as how this information is being used to adaptively manage them and to protect them from negative impacts so they will endure for future generations.
