


AB 2091 (Grayson D-Concord) Existing Trails for Nature Access

AB 2091 - Introduction

- Assembly Member Grayson has introduced legislation to support public park access on existing trails, pathways, roads and disturbed lands
- This legislation seeks to support and advance public access to open space in alignment with the state's *Pathways to 30x30* and *Outdoors for All* goals
- By reducing delays and costs associated with CEQA review, the bill ensures timely access to nature, advancing both conservation efforts and public well-being in line with the state goals






