2023 Highlights

- **Awarded ~\$1.5 million in grant funding for the Ferry Point Pier Removal project**
- **Awarded \$2.8 million in grant funding from Calfire for the Grizzly Peak Strategic Fuel Break Collaboration project**
- **Awarded \$1.25 million in grant funding for the Restore Wildcat Creek at Brook Road project**
- **Awarded ~\$4.2 million in grant funding for the Martinez Bay Trail Gap Closure project**
