BACKGROUND

Staff provides a regular update to the Board Legislative Committee of the East Bay Regional Park District's (Park District) Strategic Actions of Governmental Entities (SAGE) Program, which is managed by the Acquisition, Stewardship and Development Division. The following specific items outlined in the table below will be presented.

ANALYSIS

A monthly report of specific actions by local governmental agencies is issued to spotlight actions that have a direct nexus with the Park District's mission delivery. For this reporting period, there were two actions mapped to facilitate awareness and understanding of these matters in terms of potential impacts to the Park District as noted in the table below.

Jurisdiction	Body	Date	Description
Capitol Corridor	Joint Powers Authority	June 12	NOA of a Draft EIR for the Capitol Corridor - South Bay Connect . The project proposes to relocate Capitol Corridor passenger rail service to the existing Union Pacific Railroad Coast Subdivision between Oakland and Newark, which is a more efficient and reliable passenger rail route. The proposed Project also includes constructing a new passenger rail station at the existing Ardenwood Park-and-Ride on the Coast Subdivision. The station will serve southern Alameda County passengers and create new

transbay transit connections to the San Francisco Peninsula.

Contra Costa	Local Agency Formation Commission (LAFCo)	June 12	Contra Costa Local Agency Formation Commission approved the proposed boundary for Faria Southwest Hills Reorganization : Annexations to City of Pittsburg, Contra Costa Water District, and Delta Diablo Sanitation District. The proposed project is to build 1,500 single family residential units along with open space. The project is located southwest of the City's boundary, within the Southwest Hills planning area.
